## **Kind Reminders**

As the weather is changing, it is important for us all to stay healthy and well in order to prevent the spread or risk of infections. Please see the advice below from our Nurse's Office.

- Frequent hand washing may help to protect against infection.

## Spotlight on: Qitu our Student trilingual publication

On the 6th of September 2018,《谐趣》 our Student Magazine's chairman Andy Li and journalists Cindia Li and Linda Zheng interviewed Robin and Hansen from IG2.

Since May, these two students have been using their free time to teach visually impaired people to use computers at Shanghai Library's Visual Impairment Computer Training sector. Their hard work and abilities as trainers have helped many become a step closer to achieving their dreams.

Robin and Hansen discussed how they felt honoured when Ms Wang (the teacher they assisted) invited them to discover more about helping visually impaired people. The two students were proud of the abilities acquired during the learning process, thus, they enthusiastically agreed to assist Ms Wang in teaching blind people to perform tasks on the computer.

"Rather than using a mouse, they use the keyboard to perform tasks swiftly.

Information appearing on the screen and selected items are read aloud by the computer's reading software. The computers used were regular computers. I think this project is extremely meaningful, and I strongly recommend others to take part in it; they (visually impaired people) need as much help as they can receive. They rarely have the opportunity to

speak to people who are not blind; we were part of a minority of volunteers."

Not only are Robin and Hansen from IG2 exceptional students, but they are also kind human beings, helping others who are less fortunate. Individuals like them are the drive of today's society; let's hope to see even more charitable volunteering over the coming year.
