All Grade 1 to 5 students are invited to participate in either art competition or writing competition for the chance to have their

work exhibited at our 2020 Award Ceremony.

For the art competition, children can choose to either draw/sketch/paint a piece of artwork or make a model/ sculpture using recycled materials depicting how they envision a greener, more sustainable world. For the writing competition, children should write a letter to the mayor of Shanghai with their suggestions on how we can make Shanghai more eco-friendly and why they think this is important. For fairness' sake, the competition will be separated into two age groups: 3 - 10 and 11 - 15.

The most popular artworks will be chosen once all the entries have been collected. These pieces will then go on to charity auction according to individual participant wishes. All submissions are due by 15th December 2019. Terms and Conditions

-The contest is open to all kids aged 3-15 living in Shanghai.
-Age groups will be split into two categories: Ages 3-10/11-15
-Artworks be can either be in the form of a model/ sculpture or a piece that is drawn/sketched or painted. Please note that photos will not be accepted.
-Written pieces should be submitted in either English or Chinese and be at least 250 words.
-Artwork should be completed inA3, models/ sculptures can be any size.

-All artworks must have the entry title, participant name, school, age/ grade, and parents' phone number clearly stated on the back of the work or as a paper attachment if it is a model.
