Updates for the Winter Holiday

We strongly advise that unless your trip out of Shanghai is to visit family and is necessary, you do not leave Shanghai.

If you're leaving Shanghai, please strictly follow the local epidemic prevention regulations and report the data to school and relevant government devisioin on time.

Please notice that you will need to take full responsibility if you failed to do so.

1. People at the medium or high-risk areas in China should suspend their travel to Shanghai. They are only allowed to come or return to Shanghai until the risk level of the area is reduced to low risk.

2. Those who come or return to Shanghai from medium or high-risk areas in China, or from cities (districts) where the medium or high-risk areas are located (not the medium or high-risk areas) in China, should report to their local community offices and the employer units (or hotels) as soon as possible. The report should be within 12 hours upon arrival in Shanghai. Classified management should be implemented according to the pandemic risk level of the departure place and the passing-through place(s).

3. Those who come or return to Shanghai from or passing through the high-risk areas in China, or from towns (districts, cities) where the high-risk areas are located (not the high-risk areas) in China, or the areas where the local government has announced the blocked management areas, shall be subject to centralized quarantine for health management for 14 days, and shall be tested twice by Novel Coronavirus nucleic acid test.

4. Those who come or return to Shanghai from or passing through the medium-risk areas in China, or from towns (districts, cities) where the medium-risk areas are located (not the medium-risk areas) in China, shall be subject to strict health management in the local communities for 14 days, and shall be tested twice by Novel Coronavirus nucleic acid test.

For more details, please check the most up to date notification released by Shanghai Government.

Also, in order to make sure that your travel data is up to date and accurate,

If you have a plan to leave Shanghai, you should have emailed to form tutor with the travel details through email by Jan 19th, including the departure/return dates, transportation (flight or train number), travel route and destination. Should you have a plan to leave Shanghai after the submission deadline, please scan below QR code to finish online form before leaving Shanghai.

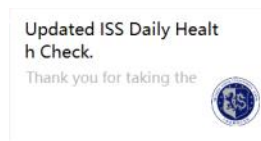


All students have been out of Shanghai during winter holidays, when you return to Shanghai, foreign students please scan below Green QR code and Chinese students for blue codes to finish online form.
